

Francization Courses



- Courses offered in Magog, Richmond, Valcourt, Val-des-Sources and Windsor
- Six hours of class time per week (two three-hour classes)
- Levels 1 to 4
- Registration available throughout the school year

Why learn French?

- To find a rewarding job
 - Speaking French will enable you to pursue your current career or branch out into a new field. It will allow you to take advantage of excellent opportunities in Quebec, where French is the official language.
- To participate in community life
- To officially immigrate to Quebec
 - Once you have completed level 4, you will be eligible to take the TEF Canada French proficiency test. You may then apply for permanent residence or Canadian citizenship.

Who can register?

- Any person 16 years of age or over, whose first language is a language other than French.

Placement test

- Placement tests during the first few classes will enable the instructor to determine each student's level of French proficiency.

What is the cost?

- There is no registration fee. However, each student should expect to spend approximately \$40 to \$50 on educational supplies.

Training allowance

- The *Ministère de l'Immigration, de la Francisation et de l'Intégration (MIFI)* offers a training and daycare allowance to persons attending Francization classes. Canadian citizens by birth are not eligible for MIFI financial assistance.

- Birth certificate or passport from your country of origin
- Document showing your immigration status (work permit, permanent resident card, certificate of citizenship, etc.)
- Health insurance card or other proof of Quebec residence
